## Additional information

**Soil Capital** is a Belgium-based agronomic and financial advisory company dedicated to accelerating the transition to regenerative agriculture across Europe. Operating in the voluntary carbon market, the company empowers farmers to adopt climate-friendly practices by monetizing the environmental value of their work—specifically through carbon certificates rather than traditional carbon credits.

Working with over 1,800 farmers across Belgium, France, and the United Kingdom, Soil Capital offers a comprehensive support program that quantifies and verifies carbon outcomes using robust, science-based methodologies. The company employs internationally recognized MRV (Monitoring, Reporting, Verification) processes, utilizing tools such as the Regrow and Cool Farm Tool models. These models calculate greenhouse gas emissions reductions and carbon sequestration compared to each farm's baseline. Independent third-party audits validate results, which are registered online to ensure transparency and traceability.

Soil Capital collaborates with food industry actors—processors, retailers, and brands—who are increasingly investing in resilient agricultural supply chains. Rather than

focusing on the trade of offsets, Soil Capital's carbon certificates enable these partners to support emission reductions within their value chains. Importantly, the majority of the financial benefits flow back to the farmers themselves, reflecting Soil Capital's "farmer-first" ethos.

The company's founding team blends agricultural and financial expertise: one cofounder is a practicing farmer, while the other comes from the finance industry. Their shared goal is to create a reliable and farmer-centric model that supports scalable, credible climate action.

In addition to field operations, Soil Capital runs Genesis, an experimental plot near its headquarters in Perwez, Wallonia, where it tests regenerative practices like agroforestry and cover cropping. The site also serves as an educational hub for policymakers and stakeholders. The company's agronomy and impact teams—including co-founder Nico and Head of Impact Andrew Voysey—are frequently involved in EU-level discussions, including with DG AGRI and as observers in emerging policy frameworks such as the Carbon Farming Certification Framework (CFCF).

Soil Capital's long-term mission is to create a robust, scalable system that makes regenerative agriculture economically viable and environmentally impactful—ensuring that both farmers and the planet can thrive.

The European Alliance for Regenerative Agriculture is a coalition working to advance regenerative agriculture across Europe. EARA brings together farmers, food businesses, researchers and advocates who share a common goal: to make agriculture more resilient, nature-positive and economically viable. ### Magnus LV – Brussegem-Merchtem

Sam Magnus runs a family farm specializing in Belgian endives (witloof/chicory), including high-end mini varieties destined for restaurant use. The operation is managed by Sam and his parents, with involvement from his siblings. The farm carries out the entire production cycle—from seed to finished product—on site, combining witloof cultivation with other edible crops and practicing crop rotation for soil health. The family has previously experimented with sweet potatoes. Sam, a former vice president of the Belgian Young Farmers Union, is known for his articulate advocacy of farming and policy, and the farm integrates modern technologies such as robotics.

**Joris Claeys** runs a mixed family farm in Lennik, at the heart of the Pajottenland region. His operation includes beef cattle and arable crops and takes a circular approach that reuses manure from the animals to fertilize his own fields—ensuring nothing goes to waste.

On his land, Joris grows sugar beets, potatoes and feed crops such as maize, grass and wheat. These products are available directly to consumers through a vending machine at the farm. Committed to sustainability, he has invested in solar panels for renewable energy and a 400,000-litre rainwater reservoir used for crop protection, cleaning and potentially future livestock drinking water.

After harvest, he plants cover crops like yellow mustard to enhance soil health and prevent erosion. On steeper slopes, he builds erosion dams to retain fertile soil. His farming methods reflect a deep respect for the landscape and natural cycles, making his farm a leading example of sustainable agriculture in Pajottenland.

#### **Transportion**

Brussels International Airport (Zaventem) is the best option for smooth transfer by train. The train station is situated in the airport directly beneath the arrivals floor. Take the train from Brussels-Airport to Brussels-North. Tickets can be bought at a terminal in the station. Transfer takes just 10 minutes and costs €11.20. If you choose to fly into Brussels Charleroi, note that transfer time to the hotel is longer (1h20) and more complicated.
